- MARCH 15TH LOCAL AREA CAUCUS TO CONVENE AT 10:00 A.M. AT A LOCATION DESIGNATED BY THE COUNTY/CITY/TOWNSHIP CHAIRMAN, UNLESS OTHERWISE AUTHORIZED BY THE MRSC CHAIRMAN.**
- March 18th Minutes of the local area caucuses are due at the MRP headquarters from each local area caucus. For your ease, an agenda template is included in your 2008 Call to Convention packet; use this template to report on the proceedings of your caucus. Included with the minutes should be the following:
- Certification of election forms for delegates & alternates to the 2008 State Convention,
 - Certification of election forms for delegates & alternates to the appropriate Congressional District Convention,
 - Any proposed changes to the 2008 Draft Platform,
 - A list of the attendees at the local area caucus, and
 - Proof the Call to the Local Caucus was advertised appropriately at least 15 days prior to the caucus.

- Also, challenges contesting delegates to the State Convention must be in the physical office of the MRP by 5:00 p.m. These challenges will be decided by the Credentials Committee of the State Convention.
